**JAMAICA CENTER BID DEBUTS NEW FAMILY HALLOWEEN EVENT:

Jamaica, Queens, October 23, 2019 – The Jamaica Center BID will host their first ever *Trick or Treat on the Ave* event this Saturday, October 26 from Noon to 3 p.m. at Rufus King Park in front of King Manor Museum (Jamaica Avenue between 150th and 153rd Streets).

The BID will provide free entertainment in Rufus King Park ranging from a bubble artist to life-sized games, a trick or treat bag design station, a temporary Halloween tattoo “parlor”, crafts, and a fall themed photo booth.

On top of the free fun in the park, participating businesses on Jamaica Avenue will hand out treats to families who stop by their storefronts during the event. Families who make a purchase at each of the participating stores can also have their BID-issued trick or treat map stamped, allowing them to enter a raffle to win Jamaica Center BID swag.
