Someone dumped garbage in front of my business or I'm experiencing loitering/non-emergency safety issues in front of my business. What should I do?

First, always report the issue to the City's complaint line (dial 311). Next, reach out to our office. We need to know about any concerning activities and patterns in our district. We have strong relationships with NYPD, Department of Homeless Services and the Department of Sanitation that can help you.

Can the BID help me negotiate my rent or give me a grant or loan?

The BID cannot help you to negotiate your rent or provide grants. But the BID can connect you to free services through the Department of Small Business Services or other support partners (see "Additional Helpful Business Resources") to receive business or legal support.
